Chairman Tesar asked for comments for or against this proposed license.

Michael Frost is purchasing Dynies in Salem, He currently owns a bar in Pleasant Prairie
Linda Valentine is opposed to issuing the license. She stated she doesn't like motorcycles and doesn't like the traffic they would present down CTH "SA" to the Kickstand or vice versa.
She wanted to know if this could be addressed.

The bar is currently zoned B-3.

Supervisor Faber has received numerous calls regarding the Kickstand and gave examples of the problems that have been there. He expressed his concerns relative to how these individuals will be addressed with the noise, taking off fast, and the drinking.

Jennifer Donat stated the motorcycles have loud pipes which awaken her at night. She also expressed traffic concerns and not just with the motorcycles. She doesn't want to be awakened at 3 and 4 in the morning. She has a problem with the noise this will create.

Linda Valentine addressed Mr. Frost and told him she would hope that they would cater to the neighborhood rather than transient customers. It would be more beneficial for the neighborhood.

Carol Haas, speaking for Arthur Bushing 25000 103rd Street, stated that it's a terribly busy intersection. Mr. Bushing doesn't feel that we need another biker bar.
