

**MINUTES

Chairman Tesar asked for comments for or against the proposed Fiscal Year 2013 Budget.

Chris Skrzynecki questioned what the department vehicles are for to which Administrator Casey informed hi this would be covered in the Special Board meeting, but they are for the Highway, Utility and Fire Departments.

John Roberts questioned if anything was going to be done for the trails to which Administrator Casey responded that only maintenance and patching will be taking place unless an opportunity afford itself.

Mike Ullstrup questioned what the profit/loss was for Pumpkin Daze to which Administrator Casey indicated that we had lost about \$1,200.

John Roberts commented that parking was a problem for Pumpkin Daze. Administrator Casey informed him that we are looking at holding it at the fairgrounds next year because of the parking.

Chairman Tesar reported that Pumpkin Daze nest year will be held on October 19, 2013.

Eileene Anderson stated that we didn't make much money, but it was a great community event.

There were no further comments for or against the proposed Fiscal Year 2013 Town of Salem Budget.
